

Criteria Form

Purpose The Structures Award was established to promote excellence in the management and administration of public works projects by recognizing the alliance between the managing agency, the consultant/architect/engineer, and the contractor who, working together complete public works projects

Eligibility Projects can be submitted by any managing agency that is a member of OPWA. The project value must fit into one of the following categories:

- 1) Projects less than \$2 million
- 2) Projects of \$2 million to \$10 million
- 3) Projects of \$10 million to \$50 million
- 4) Projects greater than \$50 million

For the Purpose of this award, Structures would include new public structures or the preservation, rehabilitation of existing public structures including municipal buildings and parks, defined as the physical structures and facilities that are developed, owned, and maintained by public agencies.

Other structures as defined in the Historical Restoration/ Preservation and Transportation categories shall not be considered in the Structures category.

To be eligible for nomination, a project must have been "substantially completed" and available for public and/or agency use, within two calendar years prior to nomination. If a project has multiple phases or segments, it is eligible if 90% is completed and available for public and/or agency use. A project may only be awarded "Project of the Year" once.

Nomination Process Nominations of candidates should be made by the managing public agency, or by OPWA Chapter or its Branches, or by OPWA members.

Deadline **March 6, 2026 to be eligible. No exceptions.**
